



2012 – The Year of Janusz Korczak

The Janusz Korczak Association of Canada has developed the following international projects this year:

• The publication and launch of the book "May their lot be lighter... Of Janusz Korczak and his pupil" by Olga Medvedeva-Nathoo. The book presents the life of Leon Gluzman who lived at Korczak's "Home for Orphans" (1923-1930; from 1930 in Canada) outlined against the background of the tumultuous events of the 20th century. It provides readers with fresh insight into the everyday life at the Orphanage, as well, it provides a sense of freedom and responsibility that was formed there. The publication of the book is a joint project of the Adam Mickiewicz University in Poznan (Poland) and the Janusz Korczak Association of Canada. The book is a bilingual Polish-English edition and is illustrated with precious archival memorabilia such as commemorative photographs and postcards which have a particular significance in Korczak's pedagogy.

• A Polish-American-Canadian collaboration resulted in the first bibliography on Janusz Korczak published in the English language (compiled by Edyta Januszewska and Daniel Berek, revised by Olga Medvedeva-Nathoo and Galina Sanaeva, Foreword by Olga Medvedeva-Nathoo). The extensive bibliography includes more than 250 entries of Janusz Korczak's writings, books about Janusz Korczak, proceedings of conferences and reports, selected articles in books, periodicals, magazines and newspapers, books featuring Janusz Korczak, movies, documentaries and on-line sources.

• The unveiling of identical bronze bas-reliefs created by Polish artist Marek Rona (1960-2012) at the Adam Mickiewicz University in Poznan and at University of British Columbia as a symbol of the future collaboration between the UBC Faculty of Education and UAM Faculty of Educational Studies.
